## Wisconsin child passenger safety

| Type of seat               | Wisconsin law   | Safest practice  |

| Rear-facing<br>Car Seat    | Children must ride in a rear-facing car seat until they are 1 year old <b>and</b> weigh 20 pounds.  | Children should ride in a rear-<br>facing car seat until at least the<br>age of 2. Keep children rear<br>facing as long as they are<br>within the age, height and weight<br>requirements for the car seat. |
| Forward-facing<br>Car Seat | Children must ride in a<br>forward-facing car seat<br>with a harness until<br>they are 4 years old<br><b>and</b> weigh 40 pounds.                   | Children should ride in a<br>forward-facing car seat with<br>a harness as long as they are<br>within the age, height and weight<br>requirements for the car seat.  |
| Booster Seat               | Children must ride<br>in a booster seat<br>until they are 8 years<br>old <b>or</b> weigh 80<br>pounds <b>or</b> are 4 feet<br>9 inches tall (4'9"). | Children should ride in a booster seat until they are tall enough to sit on the vehicle seat without slouching, <b>and</b> the seat belt fits snugly across the top of the thighs and across the shoulder. |
| Seat Belt                  | Children must be restrained in a seat belt when they outgrow the requirements of a booster seat.  | Children should ride using a lap<br>and shoulder belt once they<br>have outgrown their booster<br>seat.  |
| Back Seat                  | Children required to ride in a rear-facing or forward-facing car seat must be restrained in the back seat.  | Children under 13 years of age should ride in the back seat using a lap and shoulder belt.   |









## **Safety Tips:**

- Choose a car seat based on your child's height, weight and age.
- Read all instructions to correctly install and use the car seat.
- Check the expiration date and know the history of your car seat before you use it.
- Use a car seat correctly on every ride.
- Children are more likely to buckle up if they see a parent or caregiver buckled up.
- Let others who drive your kids know that a car seat is a must.
