SUBJECT: Fire Alarm Policy

Definitions

Milwaukee Campus:

For the purpose of this policy, Milwaukee Campus refers to Milwaukee Hospital, Clinic Building, Corporate Center and Dialysis.

Fox Valley Campus:

For the purpose of this policy, Fox Valley Campus refers to floors two, three and four on the West Pavilion of the ThedaCare Neenah campus.

Offsite Locations:

For the purpose of this policy, offsite locations refers to business occupancies used for office functions and Ambulatory Outlying Clinics including all CMS provider-based locations.

POLICY

- 1. Children's Wisconsin (CW) implements procedures to protect patients, staff, and visitors in the event of a fire. Staff response to fire situations and/or alarm events. Each department, clinic and/or offsite locations maintains a location specific fire plan that identifies response activities at and away from the fire scene.
- 2. Staff respond to fire situations or the activation of a fire alarm following the RACE system:
 - R = Remove or Rescue person(s) in immediate danger.
 - A = Activate fire alarm system or calling the fire department.
 - C = Confine or Contain the fire by closing doors.
 - E = Extinguish small fires using PASS or Evacuate area.
- 3. Staff educated in the use of a fire extinguishers should attempt to put out a small fire using the PASS Method:
 - P = Pull the pin on the neck of the fire extinguisher.
 - A = Aim at the base of the fire.
 - S = Squeeze the handle.
 - S = Sweep from side to side.

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- 4. During a fire alarm or event, a designated individual assumes fire command control and coordinated efforts until relieved by the local fire department, Environmental Safety Officer (ESO) or designee, or incident command related to a larger scale event requiring response beyond routine fire response such as evacuation.
 - a. Authorized designated Fire Command individuals include:
 - i. **Milwaukee Campus** Facilities Operations leadership, Healthcare Maintenance Mechanic on-duty, or Public Safety Supervisor on 2nd shift, 3rd shift, weekends and holidays.
 - ii. Fox Valley Campus CW-FV jointly responds to potential fire situations with ThedaCare Regional Medical Center – Neenah (TCN) staff. CW-FV has authorized TCN Security and Safety or designee to assume control of the fire response activities.
 - iii. Offsite Locations Clinic or Offsite leadership or designated staff.
 - b. Responsibilities of Fire Command individual
 - i. Coordinate fire response, area or building evacuation.
 - ii. On offsite location place secondary call to 911 to verify fire response.
 - iii. Meet Fire Department and provide information related to alarm and status of evacuation if applicable.
 - iv. Notify CW Public Safety Dispatch of fire alarm or event
 - Milwaukee Campus and Offsite Locations CW-MKE Public Safety Dispatch will:
 - a. Place secondary call to Fire Department
 - b. Notify Administrator On-Call for the appropriate entity
 - c. Notify CHW Facilities Operations On-Call Leader
 - d. Activate pre-established paging groups
 - Fox Valley Campus TCN Security will coordinate with CW-FV leadership at scene of event. CW-FV area leadership is responsible to notify CW Public Safety Dispatch of the event.
- 5. The local Fire Department has command of the scene upon arrival and will authorize when the alarm system can be reset or building/area re-entered.
 - a. Milwaukee and Fox Valley Campuses CW-MKE Facilities Operations and TCN Security is authorized to allow staff to return to normal operations related to unattended alarms. System reset still requires Fire Department authorization. Unattended alarms include:
 - i. Maintenance or testing of Fire Protection systems and accidentally triggering an alarm condition.
 - ii. Detector set of by construction or maintenance activity that produce a high level of dust or disturbance of a device.
 - iii. High level of humidity in a Heating, Ventilation and Air Conditioning (HVAC) system or unconditioned space.
 - iv. Pull station accidently activated by a child or other individuals.
- 6. The method utilized to evacuate during a fire situation or alarm is dependent upon the occupancy classification as defined by the 2012 NFPA 101 Life Safety Code and identified on department specific plans:

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- a. Healthcare or Ambulatory Occupancies Shelter in place and evacuate horizontally from smoke compartment to smoke compartment and then vertically to the exterior of the building.
- b. **Business Occupancies** Evacuate on the discovery of a fire situation or alarm vertically down the nearest stairwell to the exterior of the facility.
- c. **Mixed Occupancies Buildings** may have additional options for evacuation as identified on their location specific fire plan.
- 7. Staff receive ongoing education related to fire prevention and situation response at and away from the fire scene through general orientation, department orientations, annual safety education, fire drills and follow-up evaluations. Students, volunteer, vendors contracted staff and licensed independent practitioners are educated on how to activate a response and are instructed to follow the lead and directions of area leadership when an activated alarm or known fire event occurs.
- 8. Fire drills are conducted based upon the requirements for each occupancy type.
 - a. All staff are required to participate in fire drills.
 - b. Fire drills are coordinated and conducted by CW -MKE Facilities Operations.
 - Fox Valley Campus TCN Security and Safety has been authorized to coordinate and conducts fire drills and reports out finding to the CW ESO.
 - c. Drills are evaluated for effectiveness and for opportunities for improvement.
 - d. The EOC Committee monitors effectiveness and outcomes of all drills.
- 9. After Action Fire Alarm Event form (Addendums A and B) should be completed:
 - a. **Milwaukee Campus** Fire drills and events are evaluated by Facilities Operations and Public Safety utilizing a campus specific report format. A summary report of the evaluation and action items is managed by Facilities Operations Project Lead.
 - b. **Fox Valley Campus** TCN Security prepares a report and submits to the CW ESO for review. The Charge Nurse for each inpatient unit and the Clinic Manager or designee should submit an After-Action Fire Event Form to the CW ESO.
 - c. **Offsite Locations** The Clinic Manager or Department Manger should submit an After-Action Fire Event Form to the Facilities Operations Clinic Maintenance Manager.
- 10. All fire alarms and situations are reviewed by the CW ESO:
 - a. Determines if additional reporting to Federal, State or local regulatory agencies is necessary and coordinates the notification.
 - b. Reports findings, trends and action items to the appropriate Environment of Care EOC Committee to monitor compliance and improvement activities.
