### Managing Patient Behavioral Events (PBE)

Children's is committed to maintaining a safe, secure and healing environment within all our facilities.

#### What is a Patient Behavioral Event (PBE)?

According to Solutions for Patient Safety, a PBE can be defined as:

Level 1: Verbal or physical behaviors judged to be physically or

psychologically intimidating to staff

<u>Level 2</u>: Verbal threats or physical aggression to property, self, or staff

judged to be an imminent risk of harm

Level 3: Harmful physical contact to staff or self

**Note:** If responding to a staff or visitor who is in crisis or displaying unwelcome behaviors, please review **SAFER framework** and reference for actions taken



### Remember the importance of preventing a PBE

Personal	Physical approach- nonthreatening posture, relaxed, introduce self Attire- remove loose items such as stethoscope or badge, hair pulled back	
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	Awareness- who is in the room, location of exits, medical equipment	
	Behavioral personal protective equipment ("BPPE") (if available)- arm guards, Kevlar sleeves	
Environmental	Room safety sweep- removing harmful or unnecessary medical equipment	
	Visual barriers- blocking equipment that cannot be removed	
	Reduce stimulation- limit noise, number of people in the room, consider music or white noise	
	Limit or eliminate ligature risks when possible	
	Gathering information	
Building a plan of care	Reviewing health record	
	Ask questions	
	Documentation	
Unique strategies	Distraction/pairing- providing a preferred activity with a non-preferred	
	Medical play	
	Choices	
	Clustering care	
	Breaking down tasks	
	Visual cues- First/Then, picture board, visual timer	
Reinforcement	Creating goals

#### **Responding to a Patient Behavioral Event**

Remember above crisis prevention strategies	Promote coping skills
Examine your speech & body language	(remember that a crisis is not the time to learn a NEW
Offer choices	coping skill)
Reduce stimulation	Create a safe space
Respect personal space	Safety sweep
Create pause moments	Gather additional resources
Verbal de-escalation	Remove unnecessary items for safety
Empathize by asking questions	
Share and listen to seek a better understanding	All behavior has a purpose!
Collaborate and respectfully speak your mind	Ask: what could be causing this crisis?

#### If a Patient Behavioral Event escalates to violent or self-destructive behavior:

- Alert appropriate resources:
  - Behavioral Assessment Team (Voalte)
  - Public Safety (Call \*88)
  - Unit Leadership
  - 911 or Law Enforcement if outside of Milwaukee hospital campus
- Consider elimination of the cause of the crisis to prioritize safety
- If unable to de-escalate and safe to do so, consider exiting the room for safety
- If event requires use of violent restraints ensure appropriate orders are obtained and documentation completed according to the CW P&P Use of Restraints.



#### **Follow-up Actions**

- <u>Debrief</u> with team members present for Patient Behavioral Event- consider use of **GAINS** model below
- Create safe <u>plan</u> for future to ensure crisis does not repeat
- Report all levels of employee injury to ReadySet
- Report PBE and any patient injuries to Origami for system and safety review
- <u>Document</u> details of event including "Patient Behavioral Event" Smart-text with prompts of the following as well as any additional care plan changes:

**Approach** What strategies did you try that worked well?

What would you do differently?

Interference Did you identify any

obstacles for you or

others?

Next Steps What suggestions do you

have for the group?

**Solutions** What is the proposed

plan moving forward?

#### **Patient Behavioral Event Smart-Text**

Staff present during event:

Antecedents (What was happening prior to event?):

Where did this event occur?

What likely triggered the behavior? What behaviors were witnessed? Physical aggression to self

Physical aggression to others

Verbal aggression Property destruction Hypersexual behavior Elopement Attempt

Behavioral PPE utilized:

Were there any injuries as a result of the PBE?

Family/caregiver(s) present:

Interventions utilized/attempted by staff:

Patient's response to intervention(s):

Was anyone else notified of the event?

Were violent restraints utilized for immediate safety?

PBE Outcome:
