Specialized nurse care coordinator

Each family works with fetal nurse care coordinators to arrange medical services and provide ongoing counseling and support throughout the pregnancy.

Care for both mother and baby under one roof

Froedtert & The Medical College of Wisconsin Birth Center is located inside Children's Hospital. If neonatal intervention or surgery is anticipated, delivery at the Birth Center is recommended. Having mother and baby under one roof offers greater opportunity for breastfeeding and bonding, and allows families to meet face-to-face with their baby's care providers.

Expert care for multiples and fetal cardiac care

Multifetal Pregnancy Program

We offer one of a few perinatal centers in the country specializing in complex complications with multiple gestations. Julian De Lia, MD, world-renowned pioneer in the study and treatment of twin-related conditions, along with the team of maternal-fetal medicine specialists and pediatric surgeons, diagnose and treat complications from multiple gestations including:

- Twin-to-twin transfusion syndrome (TTTS)
- Twin reversed arterial perfusion (TRAP) sequence
- Anomalies in monochorionic twins
- Laser ablation for twin-related placental abnormalities

Fetal Cardiac Program

Our pediatric cardiologists are trained to perform and interpret prenatal cardiac ultrasounds. We utilize the most advanced ultrasound techniques to assess babies' heart problems, providing families and referring health care providers with an understanding of each baby's health issues.

What we diagnose and treat

Our team of experts coordinates care for all fetal conditions, including:

- Congenital heart defects, such as hypoplastic left heart syndrome and complex single ventricles
- Fetal arrhythmias
- Intestinal atresias
- Neurosurgical conditions such as spina bifida and hydrocephalus
- Conditions requiring prenatal and genetic consultations
- Conditions requiring surgery, such as congenital diaphragmatic hernia, pulmonary masses, gastroschisis, omphalocele and fetal vascular and lymphatic tumors
- Urologic and renal abnormalities such as bladder exstrophy, hydronephrosis and polycystic kidney disease
- Conditions requiring fetal interventions, including vesicoamniotic (bladder) and thoracoamniotic (pulmonary) shunts
- Ex-utero intrapartum treatment (EXIT) and immediate postnatal access to cardiac therapies (IMPACT) deliveries
