




USING A NEBULIZER WITH MOUTHPIECE

A nebulizer turns medicine into a mist that you can breathe deeply into your airways. Nebulizers are used when a person with asthma has trouble using a metered dose inhaler. Some medicines can be mixed together in a nebulizer. Check with your doctor or a pharmacist about mixing medicines.



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• When dry, put pieces in a plastic bag or container.

Disinfect weekly

• Soak medicine cup, T-piece and mouthpiece in half strength vinegar for at least 10 minutes or overnight.

- Rinse with water.
- Let all pieces air dry on a paper towel.
- When dry, put pieces in a plastic bag or container.

Care of the machine

- Wipe with a damp cloth.
- Check the filter monthly. Change it every six months or sooner if discolored.
- The machine should be serviced every five years.
